Resolved, That all that part of Maxwell avenue described as follows: Commencing at the southwest corner of Block 1, addition to Park Sub., being a sub. of that part of the Cook Farm, Private Claims 27 and 180, lying between St. Paul and Mack avenues; thence south 61 degrees 56 minutes west 15 feet; thence north 28 degrees 4 minutes west 551.80 feet; thence north 16 degrees 56 minutes east 14.14 feet; thence north 28 degrees 4 minutes west 100 feet; thence north 61 degrees 56 minutes east 5 feet; thence south 28 degrees 4 minutes east 661.80 feet to the place of beginning, be and is hereby vacated to the property situated on the west side of Seminole avenue, extending from St. Paul to Kercheval avenues; provided, that John Owen, Jr., deeds unto the City of Detroit for alley purposes the private way or alley lying south of and parallel with Kercheval avenue and extending from Parker avenue to Maxwell avenue, and said deed is accepted by the Committee on Ways and Means, to which Committee we recommend its reference when presented and approved by the Common Council.
