Resolved, That the City Treasurer be and he is hereby instructed to deduct from the amount of the awards due to the respondents in the above entitled cause the amount of the assessments or benefits, if any, to be paid by them on property within the assessment district and credit same to the account of said respondents as payments of special assessments on property owned by them within the assessment district adopted for the opening of said alley, and
