#### FROM THE SAME.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Committee on Street Openings, to whom was referred the petition of Virginia Avenue Improvement Association for the improvement of Virginia avenue and the dedication of certain property at the entrances thereto to the City of Detroit, as a part and parcel of the park and boulevard system, respectfully report that we have had the same under consideration and find that petitioner is a corporation duly organized under the laws of this state for the improvement and beautification of Virginia avenue; that petitioner respectfully represents that it has secured options on the land fronting on Woodward avenue on the northwest and southwest corners of Virginia avenue, and also upon the lots fronting on Hamilton Boulevard, situate on the northwest and southeast corners of Virginia avenue, which they desire to dedicate to the City of Detroit for the purpose of improving the general appearance of said thoroughfare and building thereon, at their own expense, ornamental gateways with a grass plot in the center of each entrance. Your committee, after a personal inspection of the premises, beg leave to state that we can see no possible objection to concurring in the request of petitioner and therefore recommend the adoption of the following resolution.

Resolved, That the Virginia Avenue Improvement Association be and is hereby authorized to change the entrances on Virginia avenue at Woodward avenue and Hamilton Boulevard, respectively, in accordance with the proposed plan as appears upon said blueprints; and be it further

Resolved, That the Commissioner of Parks and Boulevards be and he is hereby instructed to receive conveyances of the following described parcels of property for park purposes, to-wit: "Easterly 50 feet of lot 2 and easterly 50 feet of southerly 71.50 feet of lot 1 of Peerless addition of easterly 820 feet of north part of quarter section 56, 10,000 acre tract," also "easterly 50 feet of lot 91 and easterly 50 feet of northerly 70.20 feet of lot 92, sub. last mentioned," also "lots 46

and 47 of Peerless addition No. 3 of tract," situate on the north and south sides of Virginia avenue, respectively, between Woodward avenue and Hamilton Boulevard, and the Commissioner hereby authorized and directed to take possession of the various parcels of land hereinbefore described and maintain same as a part of the park and boulevard system of the City of Detroit,

Provided, however, That the initial expense of constructing ornamental gateway, driveways, sidewalks, planting trees and shrubs, be borne entirely by Virginia Avenue Improvement Association; and be it further

Resolved, That "all of the public alley 20 feet wide, lying between lots 90, 91 and 92 of Peerless addition of easterly 820 feet of north part of quarter section 56, 10,000 acre tract," extending southerly from the southerly line of Virginia avenue to the northerly line of the public alley first south of and parallel to Virginia avenue, between Second and Woodward avenues, be and the same is hereby vacated.
