Resolved, That the vote whereby resolution, accompanying report of Committee on Street Openings, vacating "All that part of Military avenue lying north of the north line of Toledo avenue and south of the south line of right-of-way of Michigan Central R. R.," was adopted Nov. 24, 1914 (J. C. C., p. 1912); and also the vote whereby report of Committee on Street Openings, amending above resolution by adding a proviso that certain property be deeded, adopted Dec. 15, 1914 (J. C. C., p. 1998), be and be it same are hereby rescinded, and be it further

Resolved, That "All that part of the Military avenue lying north of the north line of Toledo avenue and south of the south line of right-of-way of Michigan Central R. R.," be and the same is hereby vacated.

Provided, That petitioner, the United Fuel and Supply Co., files within 15 days from the date of the adoption of this resolution an agreement with the

City Clerk of the City of Detroit, waiving all damages that may result or accrue to said petitioner or its assigns or grantee by reason of the separation of grades at the street hereby vacated; and further

Provided, That by reason of the vacation hereby granted, the City of Detroit does not waive any rights in the public sewer located in said street; and that by reason of said vacation the City of Detroit shall at all times have the right to enter upon said premises if found necessary for the purpose of cleaning, repairing or rebuilding said public sewer; and further

Provided, That the United Fuel and Supply Co. deeds to the City of Detroit within thirty days from the date of the adoption hereof, the following described property, to-wit: "All that certain piece or parcel of land described as follows: Commencing at the southeast corner of lot 16, plat of Welch's sub-division of the southerly part of Private Claim 574 as recorded in liber 3 of plats on page 45; thence south 62 degrees west 45.70 feet; thence north 28 degrees west 341.92 feet to a point in the south line of the Michigan Central right-of-way; thence easterly along said last mentioned line 55.32 feet to a point; thence south 28 degrees east 373.05 feet to the place of beginning," exclusive of buildings, fences and sidewalks.

Provided, Petitioner pays into the City Treasury whatever expense may have been incurred by the City in the matter of furnishing crosswalks, curbing, paving, etc., within the lines of the street hereby vacated, within 15 days from the date of the adoption of this resolution, as may be certified by the City Engineer; otherwise this resolution shall be of no force or effect.
