AN ORDINANCE changing the name of Dillon avenue to Trumbull avenue

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That the name of the street and highway heretofore known as Dillon avenue, extending from Holden avenue to Grand Boulevard West, be and is hereby changed and shall hereafter be known as Trumbull avenue.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take immediate effect.
