

TENTH WARD.

By Ald. Robinson:

Resolved, That permission be granted to James McCrie, 559 Fourteenth avenue, to erect temporary railing the regulation height, between sidewalk and curb, to protect lawn.

FOURTEENTH WARD.

By Ald. Freiwald:

Resolved, That the vote whereby resolution, accompanying report of Committee on Street Openings, vacating "All that part of Hancock avenue lying between the east line of Sullivan avenue (now known as Lawton avenue), and the east line of lot 11, Trainor's sub.," etc., also, "All that part of Hancock avenue lying between the west line of lot 15, extended, and the east line of P. C. 729 of Murray & Serviss' sub.," etc., was adopted May 4, 1915 (J. C. C., p. 805), be and the same is hereby rescinded, by reason of error in description; and be it further

Resolved, That "All that part of Hancock avenue lying between the east line of Sullivan avenue (now known as Lawton avenue), and the east line extended southerly of lot 18 of Trainor's sub. of lots 10 and 11 and the northerly 24.95 feet of lots 12 and 13 of the Commissioners' Plat of O. Ls. 15 and 16 of the sub. of P. C. 729, south of Grand River avenue, Detroit, Wayne county, Michigan, as recorded in liber 17, page 48 of plats;" also, "All that part of Hancock avenue lying between the west line of lot 15, extended, and the east line of P. C. 729 of Murray & Serviss' sub. of the southerly part of lots 12 and 13 of the Commissioners' Plat of O. Ls. 15 and 16, sub. of P. C. 729, south of Grand River avenue, Detroit, Wayne county, Michigan, as recorded in liber 21, page 18 of plats" be and the same are hereby vacated.

Provided, The owners of the abutting property on the south pay into the city treasury within thirty days from the date of the adoption of this resolution, whatever expense may have been incurred by the City of Detroit in the matter of constructing curb, paving, sidewalks, crosswalks, etc., within the lines of that part of Hancock avenue herein vacated, as may be certified by the City Engineer; and further

Provided, That the petitioner, Northway Motor & Mfg. Co., file with the City Clerk within 30 days from the date of the adoption hereof, an agreement in writing, waiving therein all damages, if any, that may accrue or result to said Northway Motor & Mfg. Co., their successors or assigns, by reason of the separation of grades, on account of the vacation of said Hancock avenue, and said agreement is approved by the Corporation Counsel as being correct in form and execution and accepted by the Common Council, otherwise this resolution shall be null and void and of no force and effect.
