After having said ordinance under consideration, your committee recommends that Section 1 be amended by striking out the word "automobile" in line 4 and in the title and inserting in lieu thereof the words "electric or motor driven vehicle;" by striking out the word "automobiles" in line 7 and inserting in lieu thereof the words

"electric or motor driven vehicles;" that Section 2 be amended by striking out the words "being a resident of the City of Detroit," in lines 4 and 5; by striking out the words "Five Hundred" in line 15 and inserting in lieu thereof the words "One Thousand;" that Section 4 be amended by striking out the words "any member of the police force of the City of Detroit," in lines 17 and 18, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "the mayor, commissioner or superintendent of police or any member or members of the police department designated by them;" by inserting between the words "and" and "which" in line 22, the word "in;" by striking out the word "have" in line 22 and inserting in lieu thereof the word "be;" by striking out the word "such" in line 24; by inserting after the word "each" in line 24, the words "and every;" by inserting after the word "detail" in line 35, the following "in accordance with this ordinance," and by inserting after the word "report" in line 37, the following "and said report to be filed with the superintendent of police of the City of Detroit."
