Provided, That petitioners file with the City Clerk within 30 days from the date of the adoption of this resolution, an agreement in writing agreeing to waive all damages that may result or accrue to said grantee, its successors and assigns on the entire parcel of land effected by the vacations herein granted, lying between Erskine and Scott streets, the east line of Dequindre street and the west line of public alley to be dedicated by petitioners, by reason of the separation of grades, and said agreement is approved by the Corporation Counsel, as being correct in form and execution and accepted by the Common Council.

Municipal Docks.

by the Wabash Railroad tracks, and which will afford excellent facilities to the various sections of the city.
