Your Committee finds that petitioner is the owner of all the property abutting on that portion of Brooklyn Avenue requested to be vacated; that Brooklyn Avenue between Holden Avenue and the railroad is not used for street purposes by the public, and that the easterly 20 feet of Brooklyn Avenue not vacated will give an outlet to the alley south of Holden Avenue. Under the circumstances, your Committee can see no objection to granting the prayer of petitioner, and therefore offer the following resolution.

Resolved, That "All that part of Brooklyn Avenue lying south of the south line of Holden Avenue and north of a line extending from a point in the west line of Brooklyn Avenue, 131.16 feet south of the south line of Holden Avenue to a point in the east line of Brooklyn Avenue where the same is intersected by the south line of existing public alley, except the easterly 20 feet thereof," be and the same is hereby vacated;

Provided, That petitioner pays into the city treasury within thirty days from the date of the adoption hereof, whatever expense the city may have been put to in the matter of paving, sidewalks, crosswalks, etc., within the lines of the street herein vacated, as may be certified by the City Engineer; and further

Provided, That petitioner files with the City Clerk within thirty days from the date of the approval of this resolution, an agreement in writing, agreeing to waive all damages that may result or accrue to said grantee, its successors and assignees, on the property vacated by this resolution, by reason of the separation of grades, and said agreement is approved by the Corporation Counsel as being correct in form and execution and accepted by the Common Council.
