Ordinances.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—To your Committee on Ordinances was referred an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to Amend Sections 1 and 2 of Chapter 192 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the Year 1912." Your Committee find that the purpose of this ordinance is to regulate the hours that shall be allowed wherein children may attend theaters, moving picture shows, etc. We have had this matter under advisement, have consulted with the Superintendent of Schools and Truant Officers, and recommend
