EIGHTH WARD.

By Alderman Wilson:

An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance entitled: "An Ordinance to amend Sections 1 and 2 of Chapter 178 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1912."

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Sections 1 and 2 of Chapter 178 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1912, be, and the same are hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 1. No person, firm or corporation shall keep, maintain or operate a restaurant in the City of Detroit without having first obtained a license therefor from the Mayor. For the purpose of this ordinance the term "restaurant" as herein used shall be taken to mean and include every buffet, lunch room, lunch counter, dining room of hotel and every other public place where food is served, sold or consumed on the premises. This ordinance shall apply to all establishments where food or candy is prepared or manufactured for use. The Mayor is hereby authorized to grant a license to any person of good character, being a resident of the city, or to any firm or corporation to engage in any business named above in the City of Detroit upon the payment of the sum of \$1.00, such license shall cover but one place of business which shall be stated therein, and it shall not be assignable except by written consent of the Mayor. Every such license shall expire on November 1st of each year.

Sec. 2. Before the Mayor shall issue any license provided for in Section 1, the applicant shall furnish to him a certificate from the Board of Health stating that the establishment where applicant conducts or is about to conduct such business is a proper place in which to conduct such business. The Board of Health is hereby authorized to issue such certificate upon application of any person, firm or corporation desirous of engaging in or continuing to engage in such business. Blank applications for the purpose shall be issued by the Board of Health. Such application shall contain such information as shall be required by the Board of Health; and shall further contain an agreement by which the application consents to have the inspectors of the Board of

Health enter, examine and inspect any part of the premises used in conducting such business or any product or food manufactured or sold therein, and to take samples of food or candy for the purpose of analysis; such application shall further contain an agreement by which the applicant agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the Detroit Board of Health relative to the conduct of such business as he is conducting under such license. Every licensee shall conduct his establishment in a cleanly and sanitary manner. No licensee shall sell or offer for sale or manufacture any article of food or candy which is not clean and wholesome and which, if eaten by a human being, would be deleterious to health.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall have immediate effect. Read twice by title, ordered printed and referred to Committee on Ordinances.
