Resolved, That the Department of Public Works be and is hereby authorized and directed to issue a permit to Dime Savings Bank to install an ornamental electric standard at the corner of Jefferson avenue and Beaufait avenue, to be erected within four inches of the curb line:

Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Public Works, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said Department;

Provided, That no rights in the public streets shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said standard and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at any time when so directed by the Common Council; and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the Charter being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee to be hereafter determined upon, for the occupancy of public property, that the grantee will pay said fee provided for in such act, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed.
