Gentlemen—Your Committee of the Whole has had under consideration the petition of Durant Building Corporation (1010) for the vacation of all public alleys in the block bounded by Grand Boulevard, Second, Milwaukee and Cass avenues, together with petition (1060) for permit to construct a tunnel from power house on Baltimore avenue to proposed new office building, to cross Baltimore and Milwaukee avenues. Your committee find that said petitioner proposes to construct a large office building, occupying the whole of the block named above, and after consultation with the Department of Public Works and City Engineer, also the City Plan Commission, we recommend that said petitions be granted in accordance with the resolutions hereto attached.

Resolved, That "all of the public alley, 20 feet wide (where not already vacated) in the block bounded by West Grand Boulevard, Milwaukee

avenue, Second avenue and Cass avenue," be and the same is hereby vacated:

Provided, Petitioner pays into the city treasury, within 30 days from the date of the adoption of this resolution, whatever expense may have been incurred by the city in the matter of paving, curbing, constructing sidewalks, crosswalks, etc., within the lines of the alleys herein vacated, as may be certified by the City Engineer; and be it further

Resolved, That the Department of Public Works be and is hereby authorized and directed to issue a permit to the Durant Building Corporation to construct a tunnel across Baltimore and Milwaukee avenues to connect power house and office building of same corporation, in accordance with plans approved by the Committee of the Whole and City Plan Commission.

Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Public Works, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said Department.

Provided, That no rights in the public streets shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said tunnel, and all obstruction in connection therewith shall be removed at any time when so directed by the Common Council; and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the Charter being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee to be hereafter determined upon, for the occupancy of public property, that the grantee will pay said fee provided for in said act, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed.
