Resolved, That the Department of Public Works be and is hereby authorized and directed to issue permits to the persons and firms hereinafter designated, for the installation of gasoline and fuel oil tanks, and gasoline pumps, or both, on city property, at premises shown opposite each name, to wit:

Wilton Tool & Mfg. Co. (1 fuel oil tank in alley), 192 Elizabeth st. west.

Foster Sales and Service (1 pump), 416 Jos. Campau avenue.

McCarthy Motor Sales Co. (1 pump), 291-3-5 Dix avenue.

Henderson Tire Co. (1 pump), 82 Bagley avenue.

Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Public Works, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said department;

Provided, That no rights in the public streets shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said tanks, pumps and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at any time when so directed by the Common Council; and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works is granted with the distinct understanding that the fee provided by Ordinance 715-A shall first be deposited with said Department of Public Works and annually thereafter renewed on or before May 1 of each year.
