

Marquise.

To the Honorable the Common Council:
Gentlemen: To your Committee of the Whole was referred the petition of LaSalle Gardens Theatre Co. (2841), for permission to erect a marquise, extending 9 ft. 6 in. over lot line, on the west side of Fourteenth avenue, between Ferry Park avenue and West Grand boulevard. Seeing no objection thereto, we recommend that the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering be authorized to issue a permit for marquise as petitioned for, and offer the following resolution.

Resolved, That the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering be and is hereby authorized and directed to issue a permit to LaSalle Gardens Theatre Co., to erect a marquise, extending 9 ft. 6 in. over building line, in front of building on west side of Fourteenth street between Ferry Park avenue and West Grand Boulevard.

Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said Department;

Provided, That no rights in the public streets shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said marquise and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at any time when so directed by the Common Council; and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of Charter being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee to be hereafter determined upon, or ordinance enacted providing for an annual rental for the occupancy of public property, that the grantee will pay said fee or rental provided for in said act or ordinance, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed.

Vacation of Alley.

To the Honorable the Common Council:
Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the petition of Atkinson avenue Methodist Episcopal Church (3236), for the vacation of alley extending westerly from Twelfth street between Atkinson and Clairmount avenues, and the cancellation of taxes against property situated on the southwest corner of Twelfth street and Atkinson avenue. Petitioners being the owners of all land abutting on that part of alley requested to be vacated, which it is desired to utilize for church purposes, we recommend that the petition be granted. We further recommend that request for exemption from taxation be denied until such time as the property is actually used for church purposes.
