Chairman Simons submitted the following reports of Committee of the Whole for above date and recommended their adoption:

Vacation of Strip of Land.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the petition of Simon C. Karrer (5103), for the vacation of a 10-foot strip of land taken by the Village of St. Clair Heights in the opening of Gladwin avenue and also the 10-foot public alley lying south of lots 14, 15, 16, 19, 20 and 21 of Simon C. Karrer's subdivision. Petitioner desiring to lay out the lots in said subdivision so as to front on Gladwin avenue instead of on Sylvester street, as originally platted, making alley above referred to unnecessary for public use, and the strip of land taken in Gladwin avenue not being required for street purposes, your committee recommends that the petition be granted, on condition that petitioner pays \$165.00 for the strip in question and deeds to the city for alley purposes the East 9 feet of lot 14 of subdivision above referred to, and therefore offer the following resolution.

Karrer's sub. of part of P. C. 26," or any part of said lots.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the petition of Tiofila Ostrowski et al (5153), for the opening of Leland street across the Grand Trunk R. R. right-of-way and protesting against the storage of material and rubbish, including a steam crane in said street at the railroad tracks. After consultation with the Department of Public Works, your committee finds that scrap iron has been placed in street temporarily during construction of a sidetrack and that steam crane is being used for removal of scrap iron under permit from the Department of Public Works. We therefore recommend that the portion of petition referring to storage of material in Leland street be denied and that consideration be given to the opening of Leland street as requested in said petition.
