Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Public Works, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said Department;

Provided, That no rights in the public streets shall be considered waived by these permissions, which are granted expressly on the condition that said gasoline tanks and pumps and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at any time when so directed by the Common Council; and further

Provided, That said permits issued by the Department of Public Works are granted with the distinct understanding that the fee provided by Chapter 89 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit of 1920 shall first be deposited with said Department of Public Works and annually thereafter renewed on or before May 1 of each year, and these permits are subject to the terms of said ordinance.

Councilman Castator submitted the following reports for the above date and recommended their adoption.

Vacation of Alley.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the petition of Spencer S. Thomas (5104), for the vacation of alley, extending east and west from M. C. R. R. Belt Line Extension to Foster avenue, between Farr and Abrey avenue. Your Committee finds that petitioner is the owner of all property in said block and abutting on alley requested to be vacated, and in consideration of the closing of said alley will deed to the city for alley purposes the west 18 feet of Lot 133, extending from vacated alley to Abrey avenue. Your Committee recommends that petition be granted, provided a waiver of grade separation damages is filed, and in accordance with the accompanying resolution.

Resolved, That "all that part of the public alley, 14 feet wide, lying first north of and parallel to Farr avenue and lying between the west line of Foster avenue and east line of the Detroit Belt Line R. R. right-of-way and adjoining lots 120 to 133, inclusive, of Kosciuszko sub. of lots 11, 12 and 15 of the plat and survey of the north half of Section 28 and the northeast fraction of Section 29, T. 1 S., R. 12 E., as recorded in Liber 32, page 91 of plats of Wayne County Records," be and the same is hereby vacated;

Provided, That petitioner files with the City Clerk within 30 days from the date of the adoption of this resolution an agreement waiving all damages which may accrue to him by reason of the separation of grades affecting lots 120 to 133, inclusive, of last mentioned subdivision and vacated alley herein described; and further

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alley, the City of Detroit does not waive any rights in the lateral sewer located in the alley aforesaid, and shall at all times have the right to enter upon the premises if found necessary on account of the sewer located therein, to repair same, and provided, further, that petitioners shall not build over the above described alley without first securing the approval of the Board of Health.
