Paving South Street.

To the Honorable the Common Council:
Gentlemen: Your Committee of the Whole begs to report that it has had under consideration the petition of William T. Harms (5758), protesting against the paving of South street, between Artillery and Crossley streets as petitioned for by Board of Education, et al. (5743); also the petition of William Dalli and eight other persons, stating that their names had been placed on said petition 5743 without their knowledge or consent and also the petition of Nicholas Varga, et al., same being signed by 18 persons whose names appear on the original petition, and asking that their names be withdrawn from petition asking the paving of South street. After a public hearing on the matter and after a comparison of the signatures of the persons protesting against the paving of said street, with the signatures as they appear on the original petition, your committee recommends that the names of the persons appearing on petition of Nicholas Varga, et al., be stricken off petition of Board of Education, et al. (5743), and that all papers be referred to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of correcting said original petition for the paving of South street by the elimination of the names of all persons asking such withdrawal.

Vacation of Alley.

To the Honorable the Common Council:
Gentlemen: To your Committee of the Whole was referred the petition of Sklar & Varkle Co. (5757), for the vacation of the public alley, 16 feet wide, lying in rear of lots 250 to 257 on the south side of Knodell avenue, east of Detroit terminal railroad right-of-way. Your committee recommends that the petition be granted, petitioner being the owner of all property abutting on that part of alley requested to be vacated, and there being no means of ingress or egress to said alley except over private property, and said vacation to be on condition that petitioners waive grade separation damages on the lots owned by them and the vacated alley and on condition that they deed a 20-foot strip to the city for alley purposes to provide an outlet from remaining portion of alley into Knodell avenue.
