Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Public Works, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said Department;

Provided, That no rights in the public streets shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said pumps and tanks and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at any time when so directed by the Common Council; and further

Provided, That said permits issued by the Department of Public Works are granted with the distinct understanding that the fee provided by Chapter 89 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit of 1920, shall first be deposited with said Department of Public Works and annually thereafter renewed on or before May 1, of each year, and these permits are subject to the terms of said ordinance.

#### Vacation of Alley.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the petition of E. Percy Ashton, et al. (6865), for the vacation of a public alley 8 feet wide, first west of and parallel with Lenox avenue, extending from Kercheval avenue to alley first north thereof. Your committee finds that said alley was dedicated to the public with the expectation that the owners of property next adjoining that owned by petitioner would also dedicate 8 feet to make a 16-foot alley. A building having been constructed on the 8 feet of land necessary to make a 16-foot alley, your committee recommends that the petition be granted, petitioner being the owner of all land abutting on the alley requested to be vacated, and there being an 18-foot alley, extending along property separated by 8-foot alley, from Dickerson to Lenox avenues.

Resolved, That "All that part of the public alley, 8 feet wide, first west of and parallel to Lenox avenue and lying between the north line of Kercheval avenue and the south line of the public alley first north thereof, and adjoining the south 2 feet of lot 52, lots 53 to 55, inclusive, and the northerly part of lot 56, lying north of the north line of Kercheval avenue," be and the same is hereby vacated;

Provided, That petitioners extend the lateral sewer in the alley first north of Kercheval avenue and lying between the east line of Lenox avenue and the alley first west thereof, so as to connect with the public sewer located in Lenox avenue, at the sole expense of petitioners, and under the supervision of the Department of Public Works; and further

Provided, That petitioners pay into the City Treasurer within thirty days from the date of the adoption of this resolution, whatever expense may have been incurred by the city in the matter of paving, constructing sidewalks, crosswalks, etc., within the lines of the alley herein vacated, as may be certified by the City Engineer, otherwise this resolution to be null and void.
