Carlson (8016), asking that the property designated in resolution of Jan. 11, 1921, for the opening of Raymond avenue, between Edgewood and Woodlawn avenues, be condemned instead of property described in resolution for the opening of Raymond avenue, adopted Aug. 30, 1921, calling attention to the reconstruction of portion of main sewer and lateral sewers necessary should the street be opened as called for in resolution of Aug. 30, 1921, the new route having been decided upon and recommended for the purpose of avoiding condemnation of lots with houses. Municipal Court Building.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the communication from the Department of Public Works, asking an additional appropriation of \$6,649.00 for the installation of coal and ash handling machinery in the boiler plant of the Municipal Court Building, said amount being necessary to complete the work of combining the heating plants of the above building and Receiving Hospital, work to be done under the supervision of Research Engineer McCabe. Your Committee has also noted communication from the Research Engineer, recommending that the above appropriation be allowed as necessary for economy and good service. Your Committee recommends that the work be completed and that the resolutions attached to said communication, directing the installation of improvements in the boiler room of the new Municipal Court Building under the supervision of the Research Engineer and directing the Controller to transfer from available funds to Account 503, Public Building Fund, Connecting Heating System, M. C. Building, the sum of \$6,649, for completion of work of improvements in boiler room of Municipal Court Building, presented by Councilman Watson on the 30th ult. (J. C. C. p. 1595), be adopted.
