

Vacation of Ottawa and Huron Streets.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the communication from the Department of Recreation, requesting the vacation of all those parts of Ottawa street, Huron street and public alleys lying within the confines of Playground No. 20, located at Wabash and Pine streets. The City of Detroit being the owner of all property abutting the streets and alleys requested to be vacated, and the closing of same being necessary to the improvement of the land for playground purposes, your Committee recommends that the request be complied with and offers the following resolution.
