REPORTS OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 14, 1922.

Chairman Ewald submitted the following reports of Committee of the Whole for above date and recommended their adoption:

Vacation of Strip of Land.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the petition of Louis Stern (1654), for the vacation of the south 2 feet of Alexandrine avenue, extending from alley to Grandy avenue. Your committee finds that petitioner is the owner of lot 99, which adjoins said strip on which was located a frame building; that during the time petitioner was absent from the country in the military service of the government, the building, which was unoccupied, was torn down and used for fuel and other purposes by persons unknown to petitioner; also that an assessment of approximately \$698 has been levied against said lot 99 for the paving of Alexandrine avenue. In view of the above circumstances, your committee recommends that said strip be vacated without conditions, and offer the following resolution.
