

Chapter I, Section 12, and Title VI, Chapter III, of the Revised Charter of the City of Detroit, authorizing the Common Council to direct and regulate the construction of lateral sewers or drains for the purpose of more effectually draining all lots or cellars, yards and sinks, whenever in their opinion the same shall be necessary.

Resolved, That for the purpose of assessment for defraying and paying the cost of said vitrified crock lateral sewers, the lots and parcels of real estate within the limits of each of said alleys and abutting thereon through which each of said lateral sewers is ordered to be constructed, as set forth and described in the plat thereof submitted by the Department of Public Works, shall be and the same is hereby constituted and declared to be one local assessment district for the lateral sewer so constructed.

Resolved, That the City Engineer be and he is hereby ordered and directed to make an assessment roll on the lots and parcels of real estate within the limits of said lateral sewers and abutting thereon according to the benefit said lots and parcels of real estate shall receive from said improvement.

Resolved, That the Department of Public Works be and is hereby ordered to advertise five times for proposals for constructing said lateral sewers.

Gentlemen—In accordance with action of the Board of Education, at a meeting held March 8 last, I am petitioning your Honorable Body to vacate the following alleys, in connection with school property owned by the Board of Education:

Sherrill—Vacate all that part of Wykes avenue, 50 feet wide, lying between the south line of Alaska avenue extended, and the north line of Garden avenue extended. Also all that part of the public alley, 16 feet wide, first east of, parallel and west of, parallel to Wykes avenue, and lying between the south line of Alaska avenue extended, and the north line of Garden avenue extended, of Herbert L. Baker's Greenfield Gardens Subdivision of part of east half of northeast quarter Section 4, T. 1, S. R. 11 E., as recorded in Liber 32, page 15 of Plats of Wayne County Records.

Priest—Vacate all that part of Springwells avenue, 60 feet wide, lying between the south line of Kirkwood avenue extended, and the north line of Wagner avenue extended. Also all that part of the public alley, 18 feet wide, first east of and parallel to said Springwells avenue, and all that part of the public alley, 9 feet and 17 feet wide, first west of and parallel to said Springwells avenue, and lying between the south line of Kirkwood avenue extended, and the north line of Wagner avenue extended.

Western High—Vacate all of the public alley, 18 feet wide, first south of and parallel to Page street, and lying between the west line of the alley first west of Hubbard avenue, and the east line of the alley first east of Scotten avenue. Also all that part of the public alley, 20 feet wide, first east of and parallel to Scotten avenue, and lying between the south line of Page street, and south line of the alley first south thereof.

McKinstry—All that part of the public alley, 20 feet wide, first west of and parallel to McKinstry avenue, and lying between the south line of McMillan avenue extended, and the north line of the alley extended, first north of Dix avenue.

Provided, The Board of Education of the City of Detroit deeds to the City of Detroit for alley purposes, the following described property: "The west 25 feet of the east 133 feet of the north 318.80 feet and the south 27.50 feet of the north 318.80 feet of the east 133 feet of outlot 9, of Plat of H. Haggerty's Subdivision of part of private claim 543 and lots 14 and 15 of private claim 60, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., as recorded in Liber 5, page 48, of Plats of Wayne County Records."
