Resolved That said assessment shall be made in two parts, Part one of which shall become due and payable in 30 days after the first publication by the City Treasurer of the notice of such assessment; and further

Resolved, That the Board of Assessors of the City of Detroit be and they are hereby directed in making out said assessment roll for the opening of said Lozier avenue, to credit each piece or parcel of real estate benefitted by such improvement with its proportionate share of 85 per cent or \$556.75 of the total sum of \$655.00 received from the sale of buildings condemned in the matter of opening said Lozier Avenue, which is the same ratio agreed upon in apportioning the verdict rendered by the jury, as hereinbefore set forth, which is in conformity with the requirements of the Charter of the City of Detroit relating to special assessments for collecting the expense of public improvements where a street is graded, opened, etc.
