Vacation of Streets and Alleys

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the petition of J. B. Dinsler, et al. (6796), for the vacation of all streets and alleys as platted in Dinsler's sub. of part of Fractional Section 22, being Normandy, St. Francis, Dinsler avenues and all alleys bounded by Fenkell, Linwood, La Salle avenues and Detroit Terminal R. R. Your Committee finds that petitioners are the original proprietors who platted the subdivision in 1917 for residential purposes and that they are now desirous of re-subdividing the land into small factory sites. Your Committee has also had under consideration the communication from the City Plan Commission, recommending that petition be granted, provided petitioners establish a 20-foot setback line on Fenkell avenue, to take care of any future widening of that street. Your committee recommends that petition be granted under above conditions and offer the following resolution.

Resolved, That "All of Normandy avenue, 60 feet wide, lying between the south line of Fenkell avenue, extended, and the south line of St. Francis avenue;" also, "All of Dinsler avenue, 60 feet wide, lying between the east line of Normandy avenue, extended, and the west line of LaSalle Boulevard, extended;" also, "St. Francis avenue, 60 feet wide, lying between the east line of Linwood avenue, extended, and the west line of Normandy avenue, extended, and that part of St. Francis avenue lying between the east line of Normandy avenue, extended, and the west line of LaSalle Boulevard, extended; also, "The public alleys, 18 feet wide, first south of and parallel to Fenkell avenue and lying between the east line of Linwood avenue, extended, and the west line of Normandy avenue, extended, and between the east line of Normandy avenue, extended, and the west line of LaSalle Boulevard, extended;"

also, "All of the public alley, 18 feet wide, first south of and parallel to Dinsler avenue lying between the east line of Normandy avenue, extended, and the west line of LaSalle Boulevard, extended, and all of the public alley, 18 feet wide, first east of and parallel to Linwood avenue and lying between the south line of the alley extended first south of Fenkell avenue, and the north line of St. Francis avenue, extended," as platted in Dinsler's subdivision of part of fractional section 22, T. 1 S. R. 11 E., as recorded in Liber 39, Page 12 of Plats of Wayne County Records, be and the same are hereby vacated;

Provided, Petitioners establish a line twenty feet south of the south line of Fenkell avenue, as now opened, beyond which no buildings or other obstructions will be located; to provide for the future widening of Fenkell avenue between LaSalle Boulevard and Linwood avenue.

Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said Department.

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said barber pole and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the ex-
