

Vacation of Alley

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred a communication of John W Smith Postmaster (9208), relative to the vacation of the alley 20 feet wide first east of 18th street and lying between the southerly line of Newark street and the southerly line of lots 233 and 234 for the purpose of erecting a parcel post station. Your committee finds that the post office department is rushing its plans for erecting this building for the use of the post office by Christmas time, and after several hearings on this matter recommends the adoption of the following resolution.

Resolved, That "all that part of the public alley 20 feet wide first easterly of and parallel to 18th street and lying between the southerly line of Newark street extended and southerly line of lots 233 and 234 extended of the subdivision of part of Private Claim 473 known as the Stanton Farm as recorded in Liber 47 page 558 and 559 of deeds of Wayne County Records be and the same is hereby vacated to become part and parcel of the adjoining lots 233, 234, 235, 236, 239, 240 and 241 of the last mentioned subdivision.

Resolved, That the City Controller be and is hereby directed to execute a quit-claim deed to the proper title holder covering the property vacated by this resolution.
