Be it further resolved that there be established and set apart a fund in the sum of not to exceed \$13,000,000 for the purpose of acquiring constructing and providing a municipal lighting and power plant, underground conduits, cables and substation buildings, together with the necessary apparatus, appliances, material, machinery and equipment therefor to supply electric light and power to the City of Detroit and its inhabitants as provided by Charter, and for making extensions, additions and betterments to the existing municipal light and power system; and that Public Utility (Lighting) bonds be issued to provide the necessary money to create and establish said fund of \$13,000,000 and that said bonds be issued and sold in such amounts and in such manner and form and at such rate of interest, not in excess of six per cent. per annum and on such terms as is provided by the Charter of the City of Detroit; and

Be it further resolved, that the amounts required upon the bond issues provided for hereunder are to be limited as follows:

For the year ending June 30, 1924, \$2,000,000.

For the year ending June 30, 1925, \$4,000,000.

For the year ending June 30, 1926, \$5,500,000.

For October 1st, 1926, \$1,500,000.

Making a total of \$13,000,000.
