Welch Jr's. Wyoming-Schoolcraft subdivision of part of lot 6 Harper Tract of part of S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Frac. Sec. 21, T. 1, S. R. 11 E., as recorded in liber 46, page 98, of plats of Wayne County Records," also "all that part of the public alley, 16 feet wide first east of and parallel to Kentucky avenue and lying between the south line of Schoolcraft avenue and the north line of the south 20 feet extended of lot 46 of John M.
