2, S. R. 11 E., as recorded in liber 18, page 76, of plats of Wayne County Records," be and the same is hereby vacated to become a part and parcel of the adjoining lots above referred to.

Provided, The petitioner deeds to the City of Detroit for alley purposes "the south 7 feet of lot 26 and the north 7 feet of lot 41 of last mentioned subdivision," and further

Provided, The petitioner waives grade separation damages effecting the north 96 feet of lot 26, the south 96 feet of lot 41, lots 23 to 25 both inclusive and lots 42 to 44 both inclusive, of above mentioned subdivision, and alley herein vacated, and further

Provided, That if at any time in the future, the alley described as "the south 7 feet of lot 26 and the north 7 feet of lot 41" is ordered graded and paved, the cost of such grading and paving shall be borne entirely by the petitioner, and further

Resolved, That the City Controller be and is hereby directed to execute a quit claim deed covering the property herein vacated.
