Resolved, That "all that part of public alley, 20 ft. wide, adjoining the northerly line of the southerly 406 ft. of block 6 of subdivision of that part of the Cook Farm, P. C.'s 27, 153, 155 and 180 between Mack and Forest avenues, as recorded in liber 19, page 75 of Plats of Wayne County Records and lying between the easterly line of Maxwell ave. and the westerly line of alley first easterly and parallel thereof,"

Also "the southerly 155 ft. of public alley, 20 ft. wide, lying north of Sylvester ave. and between Maxwell and Seminole avenues of block 6 of last mentioned subdivision," be and the same are hereby vacated to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, Petitioner deeds to the City of Detroit for alley purposes "the northerly 20 ft. of the southerly 581 ft. of the easterly 110 ft.

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alley the City of Detroit does not waive any rights in the lateral sewer located in alley aforesaid and shall at all times have the right to enter upon the premises if found necessary on account of said sewer to repair same, and provided further that petitioner shall not build over the above described alley without first securing the approval of the City Engineer and the Board of Health, and further
