#### Vacation of Alley

Also "all that part of north and south public alley, 16 ft. in width, adjoining the westerly line of lots 784 to 792, both inclusive, and the westerly line of the northerly 10 ft. of lot 793 of last mentioned sub." be and the same are hereby vacated

to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, Petitioner deeds to the City of Detroit for alley purposes "the southerly 20 ft. of lot 795 of last mentioned subdivision," and further

Provided, That if at any time in the future, the alley described as "the southerly 20 ft. of lot 795" is ordered graded and paved, the entire expense of such grading and paving shall be borne by petitioner, and further,

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alley the City of Detroit does not waive any rights in the lateral sewer located in alley aforesaid and shall at all times have the right to enter upon the premises if found necessary on account of said sewer to repair same and provided further that petitioner shall not build over the above described alley without first securing the approval of the City Engineer and the Board of Health, and further

Resolved, That the Controller be and is hereby directed to execute quit claim deed covering the property herein vacated.

#### Widening Faircrest Avenue

To the Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred petition of Imperial Land Co. (897), requesting that a strip of land 5 ft. in width along the southerly part of DuNord Park Subdivision No. 2 be acquired for the widening of Faircrest Ave. Your committee is advised by the City Plan Commission that this strip blocks the north and south streets and alleys, and is of no value except for street purposes. We therefore recommend that the Corporation Counsel be instructed to prepare the proper resolution for the widening of Faircrest Ave., between Hayes Ave. and Morang Road, in accordance with blueprint No. 566-1, and submit same to this body for approval.
