

Furthermore, our City Engineer advises that when property is acquired, approximately two years will be needed to extend the fill from the shore to the harbor line, as upon advice of the Board of Health, this extension cannot be completed until the diversion of Connors Creek is accomplished.

#### Department Parks and Boulevards

September 15, 1926.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Pursuant to your request, herewith is submitted a report as to the advisability of using the municipal air port as a site for the temporary sea plane hangar for the United States Naval Reserve Squadron instead of the site in Memorial Park.

Physical conditions in the municipal air port are such that it could not be put in shape for the hangar in question for several years. A survey made by this department in the current week shows that it would be necessary to fill in the ground at the municipal air port for about a thousand feet in order to bring it to the channel line. After this fill is completed it will take two or more years for the ground to settle sufficiently to permit the construction of any buildings.

It is for these reasons thus briefly set forth that this department recommends the Memorial Park, for which permission has been granted already by your honorable body.

Herewith are submitted blue prints showing the site to be occupied by the hangar and also the detailed plans for the proposed building.
