Resolved, That "all that part of the public alley, 18 ft. in width, adjoining the westerly line of lots 4 and 5 and adjoining the easterly line of lots 6 and 7 of Chapoton's Subdivision of lot 14, block 1, of John S. Foley's Subdivision of part of the Church Farm, P. C. 16, as recorded in Liber 22, page 88 of Plats of Wayne County Records."

Provided, Petitioner deeds the easterly 11 ft. of lot 8 and the westerly 11 ft. of lot 3 of last mentioned subdivision to the City of Detroit for a turn-around, and further

Provided, That if at any time in the future the alley is paved, petitioner will bear the entire expense of paving the above-described strips dedicated for a turn-around, and further

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alley the City of Detroit does not waive any rights in the lateral sewer located in alley aforesaid and shall at all times have the right to enter upon the premises if found necessary on account of said sewer to repair same and provided further that petitioner shall not build over the above described alley without first securing the approval of the City Engineer and the Board of Health, and further

Resolved, That the City Controller be and is hereby directed to execute quit claim deed covering the property herein vacated.

Whereas, it has become necessary for the City Controller to borrow money to meet the expenditures of the City under the appropriations for the current fiscal year, therefore be it

Resolved, That the City Controller is hereby authorized and directed to borrow the sum of \$5,000,000 from the Bankers' Trust Company of New York, therefore be it further

Resolved, That the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to give to the Bankers' Trust Company of New York, fifty notes in the denomination of \$100,000 each, signed by him for the City of Detroit, such notes to be due in sixty days from March 1, 1926, and to bear interest at the rate of 4 1/2 per cent per annum, and be it further

Resolved, That said loan of \$5,000,000 is to be repaid when the proceeds from the delivery of bonds of future sale are available, and that until the payment of such sums so borrowed the faith and credit of the City of Detroit is hereby pledged.
