Whereas, an exigency and emergency has been declared to exist involving the peace, health and safety of the City of Detroit because of the necessity of constructing six additional stories to the proposed office building of the Department of Water Supply, and

Whereas, on account of the foregoing circumstances involving the peace, health and safety of the City of Detroit, it becomes necessary to borrow the sum of \$300,000 on the faith and credit of the City to carry out the aforementioned purpose, and be it

Resolved, that the City Controller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to borrow the sum of \$300,000 or such parts thereof as needed to defray the expenses of meeting and caring for such exigency and emergency at the lowest possible rate of interest which can be obtained by him in the open market, and therefore be it

Resolved, that the sum of \$300,000 be credited to the Department of Water Supply for the above purpose, and be it further

Resolved, that the sum of \$300,000 so borrowed by the City Controller shall be repaid from Revenue account of the Water Board in the fiscal year commencing July 1st, 1928, and ending June 30th, 1929.
