C. 586 as recorded in Liber 1056 of Deeds, pages 499 and 500, Wayne County Records, Michigan, thence south 29 deg. 13 min. East 92.50 ft. to a point; thence south 61 deg. 17 min. West 7.12 ft. to a point; thence north 29 deg. West 92.50 ft. to a point; thence north 61 deg. 17 min.
