By Councilman Callahan:

Resolved, That "all of the public alley, 20 ft. wide, adjoining the southerly line of the easterly 111.05 ft. of lot 330 and adjoining the northerly line of lots 326 to 329, both inclusive, and the northerly line of the easterly 9.98 ft. of lot 325 of Arthur J. Scully's Vogt Farm Subdivision of lots 8, 9, the southerly 1/2 of lot 10 and the part of lot 7 lying north of Mack ave. of Subdivision of the S. W. 1/2 of P. C. 564 also parts lying between Mack ave. and Warren ave. of lots 4 and 5 of Subdivision of the front and rear concession of P. C. 585, also part of the east 27.14 ft. of said lot 4 lying north of Warren ave. as recorded in Liber 50, page 94, of Plats of Wayne County Records, except the easterly ten feet thereof which is to be retained for the future widening of Cadieux Road," be and the same is

hereby vacated to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, Petitioner deeds to the City of Detroit for alley purposes "the westerly 2.0 ft. of lots 330, 331, the westerly 2.0 ft. of the southerly 20 ft. of lot 332, and the northerly 20 ft. of lot 332 of last mentioned subdivision," and further

Provided, That if at any time the alley described as "the northerly 20 ft. of lot 332 is ordered graded and paved, the entire expense of such grading and paving shall be borne by petitioner, and further

Provided, Petitioner agrees to pay into the City Treasury whatever expense may have been incurred by the City in the matter of paving, curbing, crosswalks, sidewalks, etc., within the lines of alley herein vacated as may be certified by the City Engineer, and further

Provided, Petitioner bears the entire expense of relocating of rerouting any public utilities now installed in said alley which it may be necessary to remove due to the closing of same, and further

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alley the City of Detroit does not waive any rights in the lateral sewer located in the alley aforesaid and shall at all times have the right to enter upon the premises if found necessary on account of said sewer to repair same, and provided further that petitioner shall not build over the above described alley without first securing the approval of the City Engineer and the Board of Health, and further

Resolved, That the City Controller be and is hereby directed to execute quit claim deed covering the property herein vacated.
