#### Vacation of St. Antoine St. and Trombly Avenue

Resolved, That "all of Trombly Avenue that adjoins the Northerly line of lots 30 and 58 of Jerome and Daly's Subdivision of lots 7 and 8 of Emilie Campaus Subdivision of the east part of fractional section No. 31, T. 1 S., R. 12 E., as recorded in Liber 6, page 82 of Plats of Wayne County Records, said portion of Trombly Avenue lying between the easterly line of St. Antoine Street and the westerly line of Oakland Avenue."

Also, "all of St. Antoine Street, 50 ft. wide, adjoining the westerly line of lots 48 to 58, both inclusive, of said Jerome and Daly's Subdivision, said portion of St. Antoine Street lying between the northerly line of Piquette Avenue and the southerly line of the New York Central Railroad Right of Way, be and the same are hereby vacated to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described streets the City of Detroit does not waive any right in the lateral sewers located in the streets aforesaid and shall at all times have the right to enter upon the premises if found necessary on account of the said sewer to repair same, and provided further, that petitioner shall not build over the above described streets without first securing

the approval of the City Engineer and the Board of Health, and further

Provided, Petitioner reimburses the owners to the extent of the value of any utilities now installed in said streets which it may be necessary to abandon, due to the closing of same, or bears the entire expense of relocating or rerouting any public utilities now installed in said streets, which it may be necessary to relocate or reroute due to the closing of same, and further

Provided, Petitioner agrees to pay into the City Treasurer whatever expense may have been incurred by the City in the matter of paving, curbing, cross walks, side walks, etc., within the lines of streets herein vacated as may be certified by the City Engineer, and further

Resolved, That the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to execute quit-claim deed covering the property herein vacated.
