By Councilman Kronk:

Resolved, That "all of public alley, 15 ft. wide, adjoining the northerly line of lot 7 of Potter's Subdivision of the south 250.43 ft. of O. L. 24, Witherell Farm, as recorded in Liber 10, page 67 of Plats of Wayne County Records," be and the same is hereby vacated to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, Petitioner deeds to the City of Detroit for alley purposes "the southerly 5 ft. of the easterly 68 ft. of lot 6 of Potter's Subdivision heretofore mentioned," and further

Provided, Petitioner files with the City Clerk within 30 days from the date of the adoption of this resolution, an agreement in writing waiving any and all claims for damage which may accrue to the portion of the alley herein vacated due to the separation of grades, and further

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alleys, the City of Detroit does not waive any rights in the lateral sewers located in alleys aforesaid, and shall, at all times, have the right to enter upon the premises if found necessary on account of said sewer to repair same, and provided further that petitioner shall not build over the above described alleys without first securing the permission of the City Engineer and the Board of Health, and further

Resolved, That the City Controller be and is hereby directed to execute quit claim deed covering the property herein vacated.
