Resolved, That "all of Hudson avenue (60 feet wide) adjoining the southerly line of lot 19 and adjoining the northerly line of lot 20 of Woodbridge's subdivision of outlots 112, 113 and 115 of the subdivision of the Woodbridge Farm as recorded in Liber 9, page 93, of Plats of Wayne County Records;"

Also, "all that part of public alley (14 feet wide) adjoining the westerly line of Woodbridge's subdivision of outlots 112, 113 and 115 heretofore mentioned, lying between the northerly line extended westerly of the southerly 26 feet of lot 19 and the southerly line extended westerly of the northerly 10 feet of lot 22 of said Woodbridge's subdivision of outlots 112, 113 and 115," be and the same are hereby vacated to become part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, Petitioner deeds to the City of Detroit for alley purposes, "the northerly 14 feet of lot 19 and the southerly 20.00 feet of lot 22 of Woodbridge's subdivision of outlots 112, 113 and 115 heretofore mentioned; also that part of outlot 3 of the subdivision of the rear of P. C. No. 27 Lognon Farm as recorded in Liber 21, Page 300 of Deeds of Wayne County Records, described as follows beginning at a point on the westerly line of 14-foot alley lying first westerly of Commonwealth avenue, being the intersection of said alley line with the northerly line extended westerly of the southerly 26 feet of lot 19 of Woodbridge's subdivision of outlots 112, 113 and 115 heretofore mentioned; thence along said alley line N. 22 deg. 54 min., 55.00 feet to a point; thence along a line S. 67 deg. 13 min., W. 6.0 feet to a point; thence along a line S. 22 deg. 54 min. E. 55 feet to a point; thence along a line N. 67 deg. 13 min., E. 6.0 feet to the place of beginning; also that part of outlot 3 of the subdivision of the rear of P. C. No. 27 heretofore mentioned described as follows: beginning at a point on the northerly line of 14-foot alley that adjoins the northerly line of Joseph McLaughlin's subdivision of the southerly 161.20 feet of lot 3 of the subdivision of the rear concession of P. C. 27, Lognon Farm, as recorded in Liber 9, page 27, of Plats of Wayne County Records, being the intersection of said alley line with the westerly line of 14-foot alley lying first west of Commonwealth avenue; thence along the northerly line of the east and west alley S. 67 deg. 13 min., W. 205.00 feet to a point; thence along a line N. 22 deg. 54 min., W. 60 ft. to a point; thence along a line N. 67 deg. 13 min., E. 205.00 feet to a point; thence along a line S. 22 deg. 54 min., E. 6.0 feet to the place of beginning."

Provided, That in the event such alleys are ordered graded and paved, expense of such grading and paving shall be borne by petitioner, and further

Provided, Petitioners agree to pay into the City Treasury whatever expense may have been incurred by the City in the matter of paving, curbing, crosswalks, sidewalks, etc., within the lines of streets and alleys herein vacated as may be certified by the City Engineer, and further

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described streets and alleys the City of Detroit does not waive any right in the lateral sewers located in streets and alleys aforesaid and shall at all times have the right to enter upon the premises if found necessary on account of said sewers to repair same, and provided further, that petitioner shall not build over the above described streets or alleys without first securing the approval of the City Engineer and the Board of Health, and further

Provided, That petitioner reimburses the owners to the extent of the value of any utilities now installed in said streets or alleys which it may be necessary to abandon due to the closing of said streets or alleys, or bears the entire expense of relocating or rerouting any public utilities now installed in said streets or alleys which it may be necessary to relocate or reroute due to the closing of said streets or alleys, and further

Resolved, That the City Controller be and is hereby directed to execute quit claim deed covering the property herein vacated.
