By Councilman Castator:

Resolved, That all that part of public alley in block bounded by Orleans, Dequindre, Gratiot and Adelaide described as follows: Beginning at a point, said point being the southwest corner of Lot 16 of Albert Crane's Sub. of Lots 7 to 16, both inclusive, Section 26, Dequindre Farm as recorded in Liber 1, Page 1 of Plats of Wayne County Records; thence North 64 Degrees 19 Minutes East, along the southerly line of said Lot 16, 105.38 feet to a point on the west line of Dequindre Street; thence South 26 Degrees East, 10 feet to a point on the northerly line of Lot 15 of said Albert Crane's Sub.; thence South 64 Degrees 19 Minutes West 95.44 feet to a point; thence North 70 Degrees 38 Minutes West 14.14 feet to the point of beginning, be and the same is hereby vacated to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alley, the City of Detroit does not waive

any right in the lateral sewer located in the alley aforesaid and shall at all times have the right to enter upon the premises if found necessary on account of said sewer to repair same and provided further, that petitioner shall not build over the above described alley without first securing the approval of the City Engineer and the Board of Health, and further

Provided, That petitioners reimburse the owners to the extent of the value of any utilities now installed in said alley which it may be necessary to abandon due to the closing of said alley or bear the entire expense of relocating or rerouting any public utilities now installed in said alley which it may be necessary to relocate or reroute due to the closing of said alley and further

Resolved, That the City Controller be and is hereby authorized to execute quit claim deeds covering the property herein vacated.
