#### Vacation of Griffin Ave.

Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was again referred petition of the Hupp Motor Car Corporation (9316), for the vacation of a portion of Griffin avenue east of Moran street. Your committee is

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance
