Resolved, That "all that part of public alley, lying between Dickerson and Lenox aves. and south of Charlevoix ave., being all that part of public alley 16 ft. wide lying east of and adjoining the easterly line of lots 44 to 48 both inclusive of Daniel J. Cam-pau's Subdivision of that part of P. Cs. 315 and 322 between Kercheval ave. and Charlevoix St., Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 29, page 44 of Plats of Wayne County Records and west of and adjoining the westerly line of lots 1 to 6 both inclusive and the northerly 15.85 ft. of lot 7 of Jefferson and Mack ave. Subdivision of that part of P. C. 689 north of Jefferson ave., Grosse Pointe (now Detroit), Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 18, page 75 of Plats of Wayne County Records," be and the same is hereby vacated to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, Petitioner deeds to the City of Detroit for alley purposes "the northerly 18 ft. of lot 8 of Jefferson and Mack Avenue Subdivision of that part of P. C. 689 north of Jefferson Avenue, Grosse Pointe (now Detroit), Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 18, page 75 of Plats of Wayne County Records, and further

Provided, Petitioner deposits with the City Treasurer, to be credited to Account 3-B, General Road Fund, the sum of \$113.09 to cover the expense of removing the paving, curbing, crosswalks, sidewalks, etc., within the lines of the alley herein vacated as may be certified by the City Engineer, and further

Provided, That when said alley described as "the north 18 ft. of lot 8" is ordered graded and paved, the entire expense of such grading and paving shall be borne by petitioner, and further

Provided, Petitioner constructs a manhole in the alley sewer near the south end of the vacated alley, and further

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alley the City of Detroit does not waive any right in the lateral sewer located therein, and shall at all times have the right to enter upon the premises if found necessary on account of said sewers to repair same, and provided further, that petitioner shall not build over the above described alley without first securing the approval of the City Engineer and the Board of Health, and further

Provided, That petitioner reimburses the owners to the extent of the value of any utilities now installed in said alley which it may be necessary to abandon due to the closing of same, or bears the entire expense of relocating or rerouting any public utilities now installed in said alley which it may be necessary to relocate or reroute due to the closing of same, and further

Resolved, That upon compliance with the provisions of this resolution the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to execute quit-claim deed covering the alley herein vacated.
