Resolved, That the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to Geo. P. McMahon to erect a projecting sign advertising The Benjamin Franklin restaurant, on building at 6564 Woodward Ave., between Milwaukee and East Grand Boulevard. Said sign to be made of steel frame work and knotty pine and to be 8 ft. 6 in. high by 5 ft. wide and to be placed 14 ft. above the sidewalk.

Provided, That said sign is removed upon the completion of this section of Woodward Avenue widening, and further

Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Building & Safety Engineering and in accordance with plans submitted and approved by said department.

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said sign and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed

by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department by said grantee at its expense; and further provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Buildings & Safety Engineering is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the Charter of the City of Detroit being amended in the manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for an occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said charter, ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of the said grantee contesting the validity of said charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee, charge or rental, or upon refusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void; and further

Provided, This resolution, is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further, that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
