After hearing with petition-

ers, consultation with the interested city departments, and careful consideration of the matter, your committee recommends that the petition be granted, in accordance with the following resolution.

By Councilman Ewald:

Whereas, the Housing Division of the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works is planning on erecting a low rental housing project, known as the Brewster Project, on land owned by the United States of America, and whereas, it has requested the vacation of certain streets and alleys abutting such land which will provide for additional recreational areas, furnish additional light and air, reduce the traffic hazard, and promote the safety and welfare of the inhabitants thereof, especially children, and whereas, under said plans the United States will pay for the grading, paving and temporary improvement of certain strips of land, referred to hereinafter, which will be conveyed to the City of Detroit for alley purposes, and whereas, the United States, without compensation, at such time as it may acquire title thereto, will convey to the City of Detroit for street purposes, the south 36 feet of lots 222 and 223, Plat of Crane and Wesson's Section of the Antoine Beaubien Farm, North of Elizabeth Street, Liber 1, page 9 of Plats, Wayne County records, and the south 36 feet of lot 3 and the south 36 feet of the East ½ of lot 4, North side of Wilkins Street, Plat of the Subdivision of the C. Moran Farm, between Gratiot and Indiana Streets, Liber 1, page 254 of Plats, Wayne County records, with proper reversion to the United States on the discontinuance of said use:

Therefore be it resolved that the following streets and public alleys located in the City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, be and the same are hereby vacated, to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property retaining however, in the City of Detroit a license in such portions of the streets so vacated for the use of City owned utilities such as public lighting, water and sewers, to maintain and install underground sewers, conduits, mains and pipes therein:

Streets

(1) All of Benton Street 50 feet wide lying between the east line of St. Antoine Street 50 feet wide and the west line of Hastings Street 50 feet wide.

(2) All of Watson Street 50 feet wide lying between a line parallel to and 10 feet easterly of the east line of Beaubien Street 40 feet wide and the west line of St. Antoine Street 50 feet wide.

(3) All of Watson Street 50 feet wide lying between the east line of St. Antoine Street 50 feet wide and a line parallel to and 70 feet westerly of the west line of Hastings Street 50 feet wide.

Alleys

(1) In the City block bounded by Beaubien, Rowena, St. Antoine and Eliot Streets, all of the north and south public alley lying between the south line of Rowena Street 50 feet wide and the north line of Eliot Street 50 feet wide and lying westerly of and adjacent to lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of Block 8, Van Dyke's Subdivision of part of the Antoine Beaubien Farm, North of Grove Street, according to the plat thereof recorded in Liber 1, page 294 of Plats, Wayne County Records; also all that part of the east and west public alley in said City block lying between the west line extended northerly of lot 11 of said subdivision and the east line extended northerly of lot 8 of said subdivision.

(2) In the City block bounded by Beaubien, Erskine, St. Antoine and Watson Streets, all of the north and south public alley lying between the south line of Erskine Street 50 feet wide and the north line of Watson Street 50 feet wide and lying westerly of and adjacent to lots 250, 251, 252, 253 and 254 Subdivision of part of Crane and Wesson's Section of Antoine Beaubien Farm, North of Elizabeth Street, according to the Plat thereof recorded in Liber 1, page 258 of Plats, Wayne County records.

(3) In the City block bounded by St. Antoine, Rowena, Hastings and Eliot Streets, all that part of the east and west public alley lying between the east line extended northerly of lot 308 Plat of Crane and Wesson's Section of the Antoine Beaubien Farm, North of Elizabeth Street, Liber 1, page 9 of Plats, Wayne County records, and the westerly line of Hastings Street 50 feet wide.

(4) In the City block bounded by St. Antoine, Eliot, Hastings and Benton Streets, all of the east and west public alley extending westerly from the west line of Hastings Street 50 feet wide to the west line extended southerly of lot 1, South side of Eliot Street, of Plat of Subdivision of C. Moran Farm between Gratiot and Indiana Streets, according to the Plat thereof recorded in Liber 1, page 254 of Plats, Wayne County records, including the north 10 feet of lot 1, North side of Benton Street, of Plat of said last named subdivision, which 10 foot strip was conveyed by the United States of America to the City of Detroit for alley purposes with reversion to the United States on discontinuance of said use, by deed dated May 20, 1936.

(5) All the public alleys lying in the City block bounded by St.

Antoine, Benton, Hastings and Erskine Streets.

(6) All the public alleys lying in the city block bounded by St. Antoine, Erskine, Hastings and Watson Streets.

(7) In the City block bounded by St. Antoine, Watson, Hastings and Wilkins Streets, all that part of the north and south public alley lying between the south line of Watson Street 50 feet wide and the south line extended westerly of lot 231 Plat of Crane and Wesson's Section of the Antoine Beaubien Farm, North of Elizabeth Street, according to the Plat thereof recorded in Liber 1, page 9 of Plats, Wayne County records and lying westerly of and adjacent to said lot 231 of said subdivision; also all that part of the east and west public alley in said City block lying between the west line of Hastings Street 50 feet wide and a line parallel to and 50 feet westerly of said line of Hastings Street.

(8) In the City block bounded by St. Antoine, Wilkins, Hastings and Brewster Streets, all of the north and south public alley lying between the south line of Wilkins Street 50 feet wide and the north line of Brewster Street 50 feet wide; also that part of the public alley in said block lying between the west line extended northerly of lot 187 Plat of Crane and Wesson's Section of the Antoine Beaubien Farm, north of Elizabeth Street, according to the Plat thereof recorded in Liber 1, page 9 of Plats, Wayne County records, and a line parallel to and 13 feet easterly of the easterly line extended northerly of said lot 187 of said subdivision.

Provided, the United States conveys to the City of Detroit for alley purposes, with proper reversion to the United States on discontinuance of said use, the following parcels of land.

(a) The south 10 feet of the easterly 30 feet of lot 26 of Plat of Subdivision of Out Lot No. 183 on the L. Beaubien Farm, Liber 1, page 97 of Plats, Wayne County records.

(b) The west 3 feet of lot 1, except the South 36 feet thereof, North side of Wilkins Street, and the east 17 feet of Lot 2, except the south 36 feet thereof, North side of Wilkins Street, and the west 3 feet of lot 1, South side of Watson Street, and the east 17 feet of lot 2, South side of Watson Street, Plat of the Subdivision of the C. Moran Farm, between Gratiot and Indiana Streets, Liber 1, page 254 of Plats, Wayne County records.

(c) The east 20 feet of lot 186, Plat of Crane and Wesson's Section of the Antoine Beaubien Farm, North of Elizabeth Street, Liber 1, page 9 of Plats, Wayne County records, and further

Provided, that this resolution shall

not become effective insofar as it concerns the alleys in any one of the city blocks in which said parcels (a), (b) and (c) are located until the said parcel (a), (b) or (c) located in such city block is so conveyed to the City of Detroit for alley purposes, but as to the alleys lying in the remaining city blocks and as to the streets hereby vacated, this resolution shall be effective without the prior conveyance of said parcels (a), (b) or (c) being a requisite thereto.

Provided, the United States conveys to the City of Detroit for street purposes, with proper reversion to the United States on discontinuance of said use, the following parcels of land:

(1) Lot 224 and the south 6 feet of lot 225, and the south 36 feet of lot 221, Plat of Crane and Wesson's Section of the Antoine Beaubien Farm, North of Elizabeth Street, Liber 1, page 9 of Plats, Wayne County records, and the south 36 feet of Lots 1 and 2, and the south 36 feet of the west 26.5 feet of lot 4, and the south 36 feet of lots 5, 6 and 7, north side of Wilkins Street, Plat of the Subdivision of the C. Moran Farm, between Gratiot and Indiana Streets, Liber 1, page 254 of Plats, Wayne County records;

(2) The westerly 10 feet of lots 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 plat of the subdivision of Out Lot No. 181 Lambert Beaubien Farm, Liber 57 of Deeds, page 2, Wayne County, Michigan, records, and also a strip of land 21.45 feet in width lying northerly of and parallel to the north line of Wilkins Street 50 feet wide, bounded on the west by a line parallel to and 10 feet easterly of the east line of Beaubien Street 40 feet wide and bounded on the east by the west line of St. Antoine Street, 50 feet wide, City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan.

Provided, that if after this resolution has become effective, petitioner desires to have removed, re-located or rerouted, any utilities now installed in said streets and alleys which are hereby vacated, petitioner shall be required to bear the expense of removing, relocating or rerouting such utilities. Owners of privately owned utilities now installed in said streets shall have the right to maintain the same and have access thereto until requested by petitioner to remove, relocate or reroute the same. And it is further

Resolved that the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to execute quit claim deeds covering the property herein vacated.
