By Councilman Engel:

Resolved, That "all that part of Brewster Street, 50 feet wide lying between the easterly line of public alley 16 feet wide first east of and parallel to Orleans Street and the westerly line of Grand Trunk Railroad Right of Way as now established," be and the same is hereby vacated to become a part and parcel of adjoining property.

Provided, Petitioners reimburse the owners to the extent of the value of any utilities now installed in said street which it may be necessary to abandon due to the closing of said street or bear the entire expense of relocating or rerouting any public utilities now installed in said street which it may be necessary to relocate or reroute due to the closing of said street, and further

Provided, That petitioners be required to construct a 5-foot inside diameter tunnel, or a 4 foot wide by 5 foot high inside measurement, culvert around the existing water pipe; the tunnel or culvert walls to be at least 1 foot thick, reinforced concrete or of heavier design to support the structure loads as designed by the company's architect; the inside bottom to be set to grade and connected to a sewer with 4 inch drain; the west end to be provided with a standard Department of Water Supply manhole with steps; the east end to be brick bulkhead. Plans for the culvert or tunnel to be approved by the Department of Water Supply, and further,

Provided, That the Department of Water Supply be granted a permanent right of way to maintain and operate the water main in said street, and further,

Provided, Petitioners, its successors or assigns file with the City Clerk within 30 days from the date of the adoption of this resolution an agreement in writing waiving any and all claims for damages which may arise due to the separation of grades affecting Brewster Street as herein vacated, and further

Provided, Petitioners pay all taxes due the City of Detroit on property herein affected and further,

Resolved, That upon compliance with the provisions of this resolution, the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to issue a quit claim deed covering property herein vacated.
