

Council a resolution authorizing the return of this money to Mr. Frye, with the exception of the amount owing the City of Detroit, which authority was given.

I have been in communication with the Attorney General's office in Detroit and they are desirous of having their share of this money turned over to the Special Administrator. They also have instructed us to turn over to the Administrator the amount of money owing to the County of Wayne.

I therefore suggest the adoption of the following resolution, so that the amount held by the City of Detroit may be turned over to Floyd A. Frye, Public Administrator and Special Administrator of the Estate of Mary Holmes, deceased, with the exception of \$877.06, which the City of Detroit claims it has coming from this fund for welfare relief.

This, of course, is held subject to the outcome of probate proceedings and the determination of the Commission on Claims.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—On April 11, last, your Honorable Body passed a resolution, granting the petition of the Economical Realty Company, et al, (6855), for the vacation of a portion of the north and south alley, first westerly of and parallel to Gratiot Avenue, between East Seven Mile Road and Maddelein Avenue, the Petitioner offering to dedicate a new alley 25 feet in width, and also an outlet to the remaining portion of the public alley, 16 feet in width.

Your resolution provided that the Petitioner deposit with the City Treasurer the sum of \$555.00 to cover the estimated cost of re-routing the existing water main for about 190 feet, and the discontinuing of about 130 feet of the old pipe, said sum to be credited to the Water Board revenue account. You further provided that the existing sewer is to be re-routed, at an estimated inspection cost of \$250.00, and required that the Petitioner deposit that amount with the Department of Public Works. You further required that the Petitioner reimburse the owners of any public utilities now installed, for the cost of re-location thereof.

We have made an examination of the abstract and title of the property dedicated to the new alley. We have received evidence from the Petitioner of the deposit of moneys as required by the resolution. We have also re-

ceived evidence from the Petitioner that adequate arrangements have been made for the re-location of publicly owned and privately owned utilities involved. We have approved the deed as correct, and therefore, recommend that the permit be conclusively granted.

W. ¼ of Sec. 1, T. 1 S., R. 12 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Mich., as recorded in Liber 59, page 52 of Plats of Wayne County Records, more particularly described as, beginning at the S. E. corner of said lot 1; thence northerly along the easterly line of said lot 42.83 ft. to a point; thence in a southwesterly direction 47.94 ft. to a point on the southerly line of said lot; thence easterly along the southerly line of said lot 22.47 ft. to the place of beginning".
