C. C. Page 1377 as the south 20 feet of Lot 29 of Subdivision of that part of Lot 16 north of Wabash R. R. P. C. 718 Springwells, Wayne Co., Michigan as recorded in Liber 16 Page 55 of Plats of Wayne County Records and that part of public alley as platted in last mentioned Subdivision lying between the southerly line of said Lot 29 as platted and the northerly line of Wabash Railway Right of Way, as now established Be and the same is hereby vacated to become a part and parcel of said Lot 29.

ORDINANCE No. 400-C

AN ORDINANCE to designate and give effect to the Compiled Ordinances of 1936.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That the Revision of the ordinances of the City of Detroit, compiled in accordance with Section 20, Chapter 1, Title III of the Charter of the City of Detroit, shall be called and known as the "Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit of 1936," and said compilation shall take effect and be in full force from and after the thirty-first day of December, A. D. 1936. The edition to include the Charter of the City of Detroit, and the Official Building Code, and shall be known as the Municipal Code of the City of Detroit of 1936.
