Kelly, a citizen of Detroit, is the National Commander of The American Legion, an organization of World War Veterans of more than 1,056,000 members, and Whereas, National Commander Kelly, prior to his election as head of The American Legion in September, 1939, had for many years, been an official of the City of Detroit, leaving the office of Corporation Counsel—in which he had established an enviable record—to accept the leadership of The American Legion, and

Whereas: The Knights of Columbus of Detroit, of which Commander Kelly is a member, and the Knights of Columbus Post No. 375 of The American Legion, will on September 7, 1940, honor Commander Kelly with a banquet and reception in Detroit, and

Whereas: This will be the last official visit of Commander Kelly prior to his relinquishing the high office of National Commander of The American Legion, which he will do at the National Convention of the Legion at Boston, Massachusetts, on September 26, 1940, and

Whereas, National Commander Kelly has given The American Legion a quality of leadership that has won the respect of not only the veterans but the nation at large, the Legion setting an example of sturdy Americanism and sanity in troublous times,

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Common Council of the City of Detroit extend an official welcome home to Commander Kelly; extend to him the felicitations of the community; and officially designate September 7, 1940, as National Commander Kelly Day in Detroit.

ORDINANCE NO. 139-D

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 1 of Article I of Chapter 25 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit of 1936.

IT IS HERBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Article I of Chapter 25 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit of 1936, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. There shall be in and for the City of Detroit an officer to be denominated the Sealer of Weights and Measures, who shall be appointed by the Police Commissioner; and the person so appointed shall have the power to perform all the duties pertaining to his office, and shall, during the time he is directed by said Commissioner to perform said duties, take charge of such standards and apparatus as shall be furnished to his department as standards for the City of Detroit, and he shall maintain such standards in good order and take all necessary precautions for their safe keeping. The Sealer of Weights and Measures shall keep a true record of all of his official acts.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance is declared to be necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and is hereby given immediate effect.
