AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 1
of Article I of Chapter 25 of the
Compiled Ordinances of the City
of Detroit of 1936.

IT IS HERBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT

Section 1. That Section 1 of Article I of Chapter 25 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit of 1936, be and the same is hereby amended to read

Section 1. There shall be in and for the City of Detroit an officer to be denominated the Sealer of Weights and Measures, who shall be appointed by the Police Commissioner; and the person so appointed shall have the power to perform all the duties pertaining to his office, and shall, during the time he is directed by said Commissioner to perform said duties, take charge of such standards and apparatus as shall be furnished to his department as standards for the City of Detroit, and he shall maintain such standards in good order and take all necessary precautions for their safe keeping. The Sealer of Weights and Measures shall keep a true record of all of his official acts.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith
