Resolved, That all of east and west



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public alley in block bounded by Andover, Irvington, Winchester Avenues and 8 Mile Road, more particularly described as that part of east and west public alley, 16 feet wide lying between the northerly line of lot 482 and the southerly line of the westerly line of lots 484 to 487, both southerly line of Gilmore and Chavenelle's Sub. No. 2 of part of N. W. ¼ of N. W. ¼ of Sec. 1, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., City of Detroit, Wayne Co., Michigan, as recorded in Liber 40, Page 94 of Plats of Wayne County Records.

Provided, Owners in fee deed to the City of Detroit all that part of lots 483 and 418 of Gilmore and Chavenelle's Sub. No. 2 of part of N. W. ¼ of N. W. ¼ of Sec. 1, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 40, Page 94 of Plats of Wayne County Records, more particularly described as the easterly 8.94 feet of said lot 483 and the westerly 9.06 feet of said lot 418, except 8 Mile Road as widened. To be used for alley purposes; and further

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alley the City of Detroit does not waive any rights to the lateral sewer located therein and at all times shall have the right to enter upon the premises, if found necessary on account of said sewer to repair same, and further provided if a Building is to be constructed over said vacated alley said sewer must be replaced with cast iron pipe of the same size. Plans of the new building are to be submitted to the City Engineer and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineers; and further

Provided, Owner in fee produce an abstract or other satisfactory record showing title to the grantor conveying above described property to the City of Detroit; and further

Resolved, That upon compliance with the above provisos the City Con-

troller be and is hereby directed to issue Quit Claim Deeds to Fidelity Builders, Incorporated, a Michigan Corporation and to William T. Barbour as owners in fee of adjoining property.
